The second half of Spring term has been full of enjoyable activities and challenges. We engaged in a number of national and international celebrations. Students and staff enjoyed a day in their pyjamas, for National Sleep Day, co-joined with Red Nose Day, some pyjamas were red to complete the Red Nose theme. Endeavour Academy hosted an open afternoon for all parents. This event included individual advice around communication, sensory needs, transition and funding and benefit advice, as well as advice around specific behaviours. Parents also had the opportunity to speak to class teachers and also to each other. This is extremely beneficial.

This term Endeavour students had the opportunity to get advice from an Adviza representative. Adviza specialise in career advice and we had two visits from the representative who met with pupils individually and explored their aspirations and wishes.

We were very happy to be visited by Sheila Hore who led a number of pottery sessions in the school. The students enjoyed this activity and made some amazing pottery butterflies and other animals. These will be available to purchase during our next open event.

A group of pupils also recently had the opportunity to participate in Parability. This is an annual sports event hosted by Blackbird Leys Sport Centre. All pupils really enjoyed their day taking part in various sporting activities and came back to school very tired but with smiles on their faces.

We are happy to announce that some building work will start in the school over the Easter holiday. Hexagon Hub, our new school café area, should be ready by the end of July. This is very exciting time for us as the café will increase the learning space in the building, as well as offering new learning opportunities to pupils. Some additional noise is expected across the school after Easter and our carpark might become a little busier. We have been preparing our pupils for the building work through social stories and other forms of communication aids.

The most exciting news was the arrival of 10 beautiful chicks. We had the full hatching (10 out of 10) this year, which is very exciting and a new experience. Our pupils have been looking after 5 male and 5 female chicks over the past couple of weeks and a number of the chicks will be leaving Endeavour Academy with staff members.

We also held our Annual Easter Egg Hunt on the last day of term which was enjoyed by all.




Star Class



Star Class


