Next week:

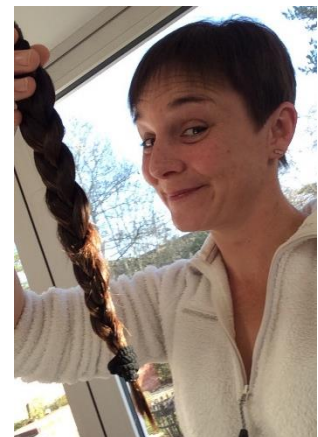
