






Triangle Class



























































Morning Organising Achievements!



We are so proud of our students accessing the daily organising routine in the hall (and throughout the day), completing their ALERTING-ORGANISING-CALMING routine to get bodies and brains ready for lessons.

Staff continue to be amazing at adapting routines so that a student can have an individualised program if the big busy hall is not suitable for them. This includes some heavy work with gym bags, using the static gym equipment (rower or bike), the bouldering wall, walking in the wooded area behind school or a calming massage in the sensory or therapy room if deep pressure is not wanted.

This routine is a key part of the school day where students join sensory and motor skills together.











All students who have school dinners had the opportunity to choose their favourite foods for the Summer term's menu. Each student was asked individually and was provided with a 'Student Feedback Form' with pictures and names of different options for them to choose from. This initiative has been used before which has been successful. The result, is an adapted menu with the most popular dishes chosen by them.
