
Our new Staff

Square Class

In square class we have been focussed on students working towards their individual learning goals. We have had some excellent progress in the class.

Rehan has had some great interactions with people who he works with and has been trying out lots of activities that encourage interaction with an adult. Particular favourites of his are water play, leaves and bubbles. Rehan now explores lots of areas of the school.

Zach had targets to complete an adult led activity and to follow a visual schedule. He achieved these with flying colours. Zach uses a visual schedule that he follows to inform him what activities he needs to complete. He completes many adult-led activities each day and has shown progress in a range of skills.

One of Grace's targets was to work on personal care skills. We have been pleased with the progress she has made in looking after herself, particularly showering, washing thoroughly and hair drying. All these are done with a visual schedule and minimal verbal prompting.

Darragh has been exploring his community. He goes on regular trips around the local community as well as forest school, Thomley Hall, walks in the woods, shopping and horse riding. It is great that he gets such enrichment and it gives him opportunities to socialise, build life skills and burn off some of his energy. Darragh has also made progress with engagement in table activities and signing for personal needs.

Jasmine's communication has improved including using a communication book, signing, telling us if something is wrong or just general social chit chat. She has made excellent progress in her personal care which could be life changing for her. She has also developed play skills in girl group.

Charlie follows his daily schedule really well. He completes all his scheduled work. He has also developed life skills such as food preparation and cleaning. He has engaged well in his morning OT programme. Charlie has been motivated to work hard in school in the morning then explore the community in the last hour of school, including going for walks in the countryside.

Amy has become settled in her new school and has formed great relations with people in square class. She had a target to follow a visual schedule which she does really well from a daily schedule and a now and next board. She is very productive in class and has made good progress in communication skills.

Well done to all the students.



In star class we are incredibly focused on learning and developing skills through a variety of exciting activities. These have been taking place within the classroom as well as at various outside locations.

Personal care sessions are taking place daily. These sessions include body awareness, face/hands washing, as well as teeth and hair brushing. The students have enjoyed these activities.

All students have shown such resilience and continued to work incredibly hard on completing individualised OT programmes, working towards or independently using communication systems as well as accessing therapy sessions. These sessions have included, art, playdough, reflexology and food exploration to name a few.













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


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Speech and Language




Many of our students have really got involved in using chat boards or communication boards this term. Students can use these when they no longer need to exchange a symbol, as in PECS, and instead know that by pointing they are communicating. It becomes easier to think about making comments too, rather than just requesting, and we've had lots of fun learning new vocabulary and talking about what we are playing with.

We can also use communication boards to help support longer phrases and sentences when students do ask for things, and also to give each other instructions.


We use chat boards as a prompt to talk about topics that our students are really interested in too, and this is a nice way for students to learn how to start a conversation with another person.

We make boards about topics of interest, trips, what we can see in school, and for sets of Playmobil, Lego or toys that we share.
