ZONES OF REGULATION

This term we have had a huge focus on Zones of Regulation. The students have been gaining consistency in checking in every morning and throughout the day and many students are becoming more accurate in identifying their own emotions!

We are noticing that some students are beginning to recognize when they are feeling different emotions and sometimes even able to choose a tool to help to regulate themselves. We know that self regulation is a huge goal for many of our students and something we continually work on throughout the day across house and school.


With some students (those who are ready) we are now able to move forward in creating their personalized Zone's toolkits in which they will work on with Nicola and myself. Some families have been asked to provide feedback on what they notice helps their child when they feel different emotions throughout the day.

RESEARCH

We are in the process of recruiting for an exciting study through the University of Reading, looking at sensory reactivity and mental health. Our students are often omitted from research, and it is exciting to be involved, as we all know the link between sensory processing and mental health – though this is yet to be proven in research. This is focused on students aged 13-17 years, and you have the option of participating directly in the survey & interview (takes about 45 mins), or providing consent Endeavour staff to complete the research on your behalf. JOIN OUR SENSORY STUDY!



AIMS

To explore the relationship between sensory symptoms and mood in autistic teenagers.

WHO

This study is looking for:

- · Autistic teenagers (13-17yrs) who use verbal communication; or
- Parents or carers of autistic teenagers who use few to no words (less than 500 words)

PROCEDURE

We will explore how our responses to sensory stimuli (e.g. lights, sounds and touch) can impact on the way we feel.

The study involves:

- 1) An online survey
- 2) An online interview

The study will take approximately 1 hour. Participants can have a support person with them.

Participants will receive £10 for their time, and go in the draw to win £50.

This study has been reviewed by the University Research Ethics Committee and has been given favourable ethical opinion for conduct.

From everyone at ASC to all our families have a lovely Christmas and new year and we will see you in 2022
















Welcome, Helen!
