for their annual Christmas dinner.


Our young people enjoyed a number of festive activities this term such as Pantos, and our Christmas market, for which they worked very hard creating lots of amazing gifts to sell.








Square Class

We have been very busy in Square Class this term and we would like share some of our favourite highlights with you as seen in the pictures below
















Triangle Class

What Have the University Students at Endeavour Academy Been Up to This Term?

Abi - Student Speech and Language Therapist.

University of Reading

Abi has been working with the students on understanding relationships and appropriate interactions within different relationships. In addition, Abi has been working on the student speech skills - forming sounds and phonics as steppingstones to clear speech. The students have been forming sentences using colourful semantics (a colour coded sentence template) to describe scenarios in pictures. Most importantly Abi has brought a creative and fun approach to speech and language at Endeavour Academy.



Sophie - Student Occupational Therapist

Oxford Brookes University

Sophie has mostly been working on regulation with the younger years at Endeavour Academy, encouraging a wide range of sensory activities in classrooms. The students have been engaging in regulating physical activity such as sensory circuits (a sequence of regulating movements) and the interactive floor as well as tactile activities such as messy play with slime, water and grains and deep pressure.

With the older students Sophie has focused on zones of regulation, a tool used to allow the students to express their emotions, understand their feelings and to support regulation with a toolkit. The toolkit allows the student to calm or alert themselves accordingly with a regulating strategy. The students have made progress in this and are encouraged to 'check in' with their emotions each day.


We have been doing some Arts & Crafts activities in small groups which our young people have really enjoyed, I feel it's a lovely way for them to express their individuality.





Wellbeing Christmas challenge
